1. Apologies were received from Councillor S Rowe
2. Matters arising from the last Annual Parish Meeting
None.
3. To receive the Chairman's report
Cllr Pocock read out his report for the past year and outlined the key objectives for the forthcoming year.
4. Reports from Organisations
 - i. Hayle Day Care Centre – The Chairman read out a written report received from the Trust which thanked the Parish Council on their grant donation.
 - ii. Hall for Gwinear – Cllr Roberts gave a brief report regarding the work carried out at the hall over the past year and thanked the Parish Council for their donation which helped provide the hall with a much needed disabled access ramp.
 - iii. Pen Tye Residents Association – Mrs Clay gave a brief verbal report on the work carried out by the Association in the past year to include a bonfire night and Christmas party. Mrs Clay thanked the Parish Council for their grant donation which provided Christmas costumes and a tea urn for the association, the association were looking for hold further events in the coming months to include four discos for two age groups, the first being 6-12 year olds and the second being 13-17 year olds and they would be taking place in Wall Hall. Mrs Clay thanked Cllr Roberts for helping the association clear out two rooms at Wall hall in preparation for the discos but was disappointed that no young people had helped on the clear out day as they had been asked if they would help out as the discos were for their benefit but she hoped that the associations efforts would not be in vain and that the discos would help to reduce anti-social behaviour within the village.
 - iv. Womens Institute - Cllr Marks reported that the local Womens Institute would like to thank the Parish Council for their grant donation.
 - v. PAROW – Cllr Thurnell-Read commented that PAROW were currently made up of an informal group working within the area of Penwith and were meeting today to discuss their future after receiving a grant of around £48,000. This went towards the employment of two members of staff and equipment etc.
5. Items raised by Parishioners
Mrs M'Ghie commented that the surface of Trevarnon Lane was in poor repair and needed complete resurfacing; she noted that the top was thinning and raised concerns regarding a gas main which she believed was not very far under the surface. The meeting agreed to write a letter raising the concerns highlighted by the Parishioner to the Highways department of Cornwall Council who are responsible for the road surface at Trevarnon Lane.
