## Mobile Library Consultation Update

We are currently consulting on how mobile library and mobile one stop shop services are delivered in your community and have already received a good level of response.

The 12 week consultation was launched in February and alongside directly canvassing the views of current service users we have been attending all Community Network meetings across Cornwall to discuss proposals with communities, members and Parish/Town Councils.

The existing mobile service is facing a 50% budget cut and we are undertaking consultation on plans to either reduce the current number of mobile vans and frequency of stops or cease the current service, replacing it with a number of community based initiatives.

We are seeking the views of service users and community representatives as we consult on the possibility of delivering these services in a different way  
Do you have any ideas on how this service could be delivered in a different way in your

village or town? Do you have some thoughts on where and how this would work e.g. community venues that could be suitable to host a 'micro' library?

## **Empty Property – New leaflet about reporting empty properties**

The issue of empty homes is the subject of increased national and local awareness and action. Empty properties are a wasted resource which could be used for much needed homes. They can be an eyesore or cause other problems.

Cornwall Council's strategy aims to bring empty properties back into habitable use, thereby contributing to increased housing (including affordable housing) supply, with associated benefits of improving problem properties and removing any adverse effect on neighbouring properties and the area. The Council's objective is to pro-actively identify and resolve empty property cases through coordinated provision of advice and financial assistance (including referral to relevant loan, leasing or repair and lease schemes) and, where necessary (as a last resort), appropriate enforcement action.

The Council is able to identify some empty properties from available records, and communicates with owners in an effort to bring properties back into habitable use. But it is likely that there will be others which the Council is not aware of.

To enable people to report an empty property, the Council has produced a new leaflet including a cut-off section to fill in and post to us. We'll then make enquiries and try to get the property brought back into use. Another part of the leaflet can be dropped through the property's letter box to let the owner know about the help available. We'll then make arrangements for you to collect them, or we may be able to deliver.
